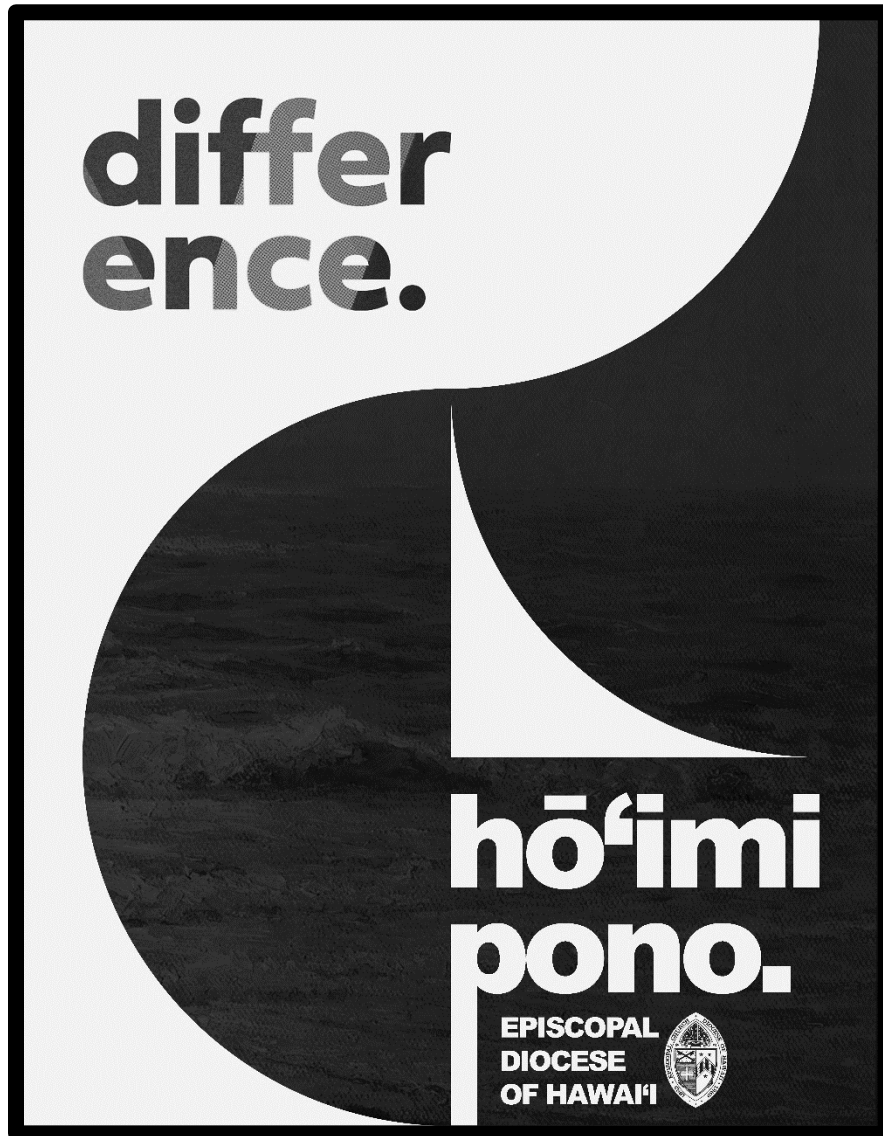

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HYMN: SING A NEW CHURCH

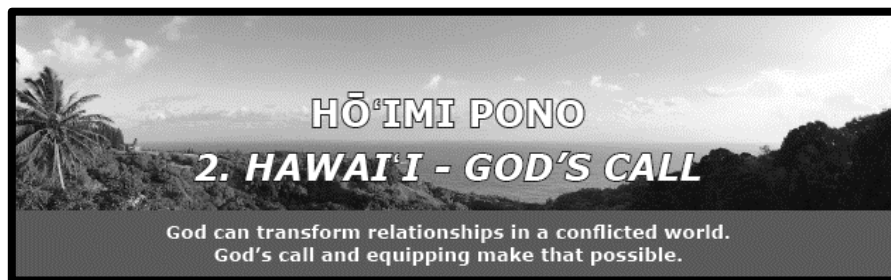
Sung to the tune: Nettleton
